# HOW TO DEVELOP A NATIONAL LIST OF ESSENTIAL IN VITRO DIAGNOSTICS

The WHO Model list of essential in vitro diagnostics (EDL) is an evidence-based resource to support countries in prioritizing in vitro diagnostics tests for each level of the healthcare system.

This webinar follows the recent publication of the third edition of the EDL and accompanying guidance document on national list of essential in vitro diagnostics (NEDL) development.

It will delve into the EDL scope and contents, including the criteria for selecting IVD tests categories. The webinar will provide guidance to countries to develop or update their own NEDL adapted to local context and needs. Nigeria's recent experience of developing a national list will be shared.

Access to high quality in vitro diagnostic tests and laboratory services can contribute to achieving Universal Health Coverage (UHC), addressing health emergencies and promoting healthier populations
